Go to Murchison Falls Game Park

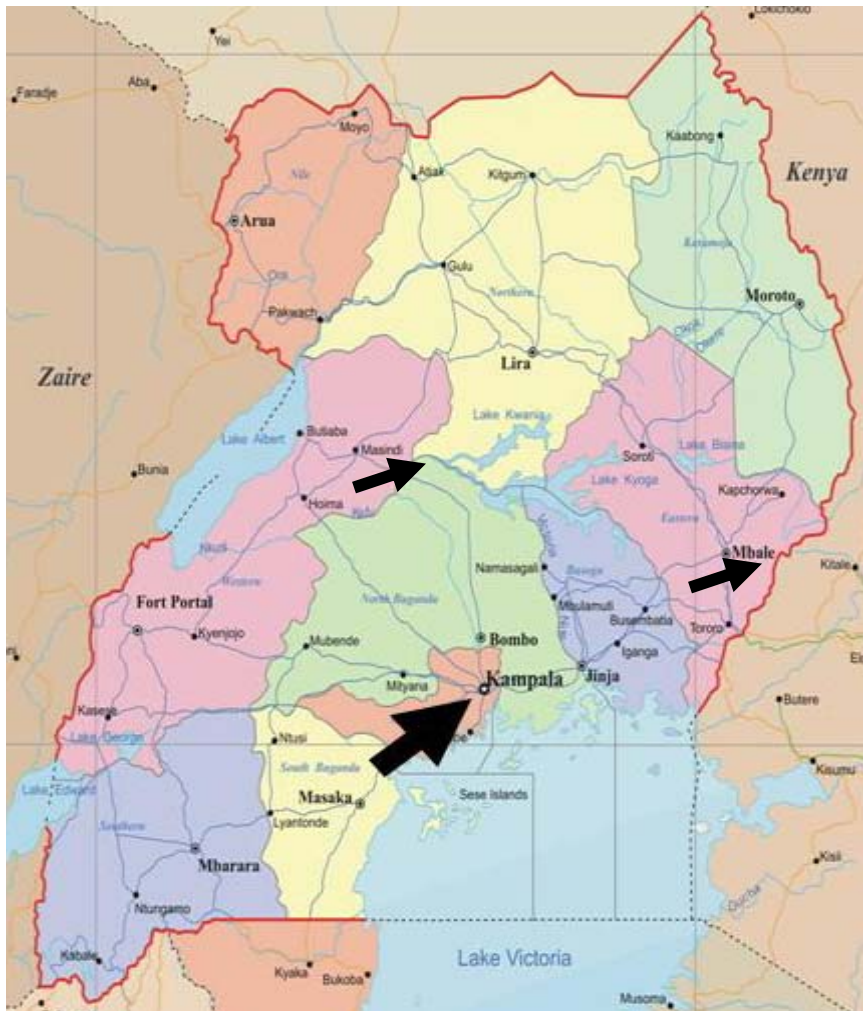

Jamestown, NY

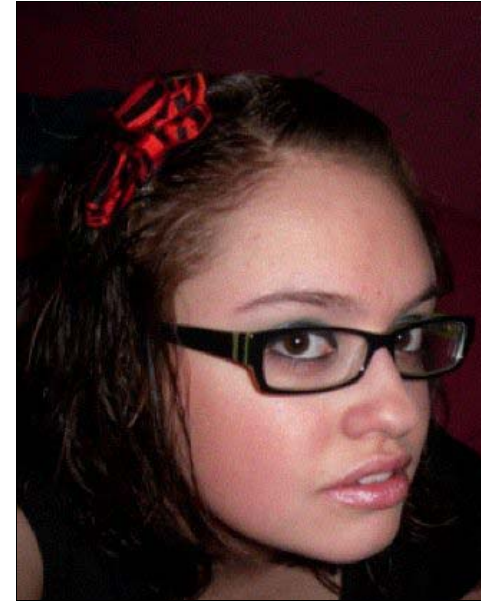
Daughter, and Engaged to be married

Wife, Mother and Grandmother

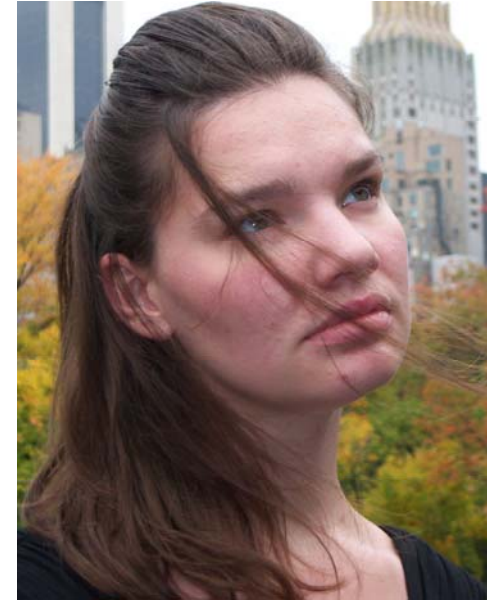
Married to Boyd
